

Literacy

- Gives meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint.
- Develop their phonological awareness, so that they can spot and suggest rhymes and count or clap syllables in a word.
- Recognise words with the same initial sound.
- Write some or all of their name.
- Write some letters accurately.

Mathematics

- Experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.
- Extend and create ABAB patterns.
- Solve real world mathematical problems with numbers up to 5.
- Name and describe 2D and 3D shapes.
- Understand position through words alone – for example, “The bag is under the table”.

Communication and Language

- Is able to talk about familiar books and be able to tell a story.
- Uses talk to organise themselves and their play.
- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.

Personal, Social and Emotional

- Children do not always need an adult to remind them of a rule.
- Develop appropriate ways of being assertive.
- Talk with others to solve conflicts.
- Talk about their feelings using words like ‘happy’, ‘sad’, and ‘angry’ or ‘worried’.

Understanding the World

- Talk about what they see, using a wide vocabulary.
- Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.
- Know that there are different countries in the world.

Expressive Art and Design

- Join different materials and explore different textures.
- Draws using more detail.
- Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear etc.
- Explore colour and colour mixing. Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas.

Physical Development

- Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.
- Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks.
