Communication and Language

- Express ideas and feelings about their experiences e.g. Easter and Mother's Day.
- Listen attentively and respond to what they hear.
- Use past, present and future forms accurately.
- Use recently introduced vocabulary to express ideas.
- Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities, explain how thing work and why they might happen.
- Ask questions to clarify their understanding.

Literacy

- Demonstrate understanding of what has been read to them by retelling stories and narratives using their own words and recently introduced vocabulary.
- Write 'tricky' words correctly in sentences.
- Write short sentences using phonics to spell words using a capital letter and full stop.
- Anticipate (where appropriate) key events in stories.

Understanding the World

- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now.
- Discuss their immediate environment using knowledge from observations and non-fiction texts.
- Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants.
