
Headteacher's Note

This classic book tells the story of a little pig named Wilbur, who befriends a wise and caring spider, Charlotte. Through their friendship, Charlotte helps Wilbur in ways he never imagined, showing the true power of kindness and loyalty. Interestingly, *Charlotte's Web* was published around the same time our school opened, in 1952, and is one of the books that we read in depth in class as part of our English curriculum.
