

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## PARENT SURVEY FEEDBACK SUMMARY

#### Summary of Best Things About the School

Parents highlighted several strengths of Gilbert Colvin Primary School:

- Leadership and Management: The new headteacher and senior staff have created a welcoming and supportive environment.
- Staff and Teaching: Teachers and staff are approachable, supportive, and dedicated to students' success. The nursery staff received particular praise.
- Environment and Community: A safe, friendly, and inclusive atmosphere fosters collaboration and happiness among students and parents.
- Extracurricular Activities: Clubs, assemblies, and themed days such as Number Day, World Book Day, and Glow Day, are enjoyed and well-loved.
- Communication: Parents value clear communication and consistent feedback about their children's progress.
- Facilities: The outdoor space, playgrounds, and edible garden were highlighted as positive features.
- Diversity and Inclusion: Parents appreciated the multicultural approach and inclusive environment for all faiths and communities.

#### Summary of Areas for Development

Parents identified key areas for improvement:

- School Meals and Facilities: Improve food quality (ensure meals are hot and sufficient) and hygiene in toilets. Enhance outdoor facilities for activities.
- Communication: Provide better updates on events, more curriculum information, and involve parents in decision-making about RSHE topics.
- Clubs and Activities: Increase the variety and affordability of after-school and breakfast clubs. Offer more trips, competitions, and physical activities.
- Curriculum: Introduce language classes, interactive learning methods, and more creative assignments. Provide more individualised homework and learning plans.
- Safety and Supervision: Strengthen playground supervision, ensure better security around toilets, and promote anti-bullying initiatives.
- Facilities: Invest in new equipment such as ICT tools and new chairs, and improve ventilation and air quality.
- Parental Involvement: Increase opportunities for parental input and feedback, e.g., through a "You Said, We Did" board.
