

# Parent Forum: Attendance

### Why attendance matters

- Academic success: Research shows a strong link between high attendance and achievement.
- Engagement: Regular attendance helps children build friendships and adapt to routines.
- Continuity: Missing lessons makes learning harder and disrupts progress.
- Future readiness: Good attendance supports smooth transitions to secondary school, higher education, and employment.
- Safety and well-being: Daily attendance ensures we know your child is safe and supported.



### **EEF, DfE and wider evidence**

- Parental engagement: Involving families improves attendance.
- Responsive interventions: Tailored support addressing individual causes of absence shows promise.
- Whole-school culture: Clear expectations and consistent routines encourage attendance.
- Link between attendance and attainment: Pupils with 95%+ attendance are far more likely to meet expected standards.
- **Persistent absence:** Missing more than 10% of school days nearly doubles risk of underachievement.



### **EEF, DfE and wider evidence**

- Post-pandemic trends: Absence rose to 7.6% in 2021/22, now falling but still above pre-COVID levels.
- Enrichment activities: Sports, arts, volunteering linked to improved attendance.
- Community partnerships: Collaboration with local services supports families facing barriers.
- **Equity focus:** Disadvantaged pupils are disproportionately affected by poor attendance.



#### **School commitment**

- Raising awareness: We regularly inform pupils and parents about the importance of attendance.
- Daily monitoring: Attendance is tracked every day, with follow-up on absences.
- Attendance goals: We aim for at least 96% attendance across the school.
- Data tracking and support: We monitor patterns and provide tailored assistance to families.
- External partnerships: We work with Education Welfare Officers and Redbridge Children's Services when needed.
- **Escalation**: If support measures fail, statutory actions may be taken by the Local Authority.



### How parents can help

- **Ensure punctuality:** Arrive between 8.45-9.00 AM.
- Report absences: Notify school on each day of absence.
- Plan appointments: Outside school hours whenever possible.
- Encourage routines: Consistent bedtime and morning habits.



# **Processes in place**

- **Electronic register**: Attendance recorded twice daily using national codes.
- **First-day contact**: Parents contacted immediately if a child is absent without notice.
- Support plans: Tailored interventions for families facing barriers.
- Escalation procedures: Fixed penalty notices or supervision orders if attendance does not improve.



# Roles and responsibilities

- Governing Board: Sets expectations and monitors attendance data.
- **Headteacher**: Implements policy, monitors absence, and communicates expectations.
- Attendance Officer: Tracks data, liaises with families, and advises on interventions.
- Class Teachers: Record attendance daily and support punctuality.
- **Parents**: Ensure daily attendance, report absences, and provide emergency contacts.
- **Pupils**: Attend school every day, on time.



#### **Conclusion**

Good attendance = better learning, friendships, and future opportunities.
